## 1. Stake-Provided Equipment Required for Encampment

There are several items that each Stake is being asked to provide, that will be used for Encampment as a whole, and will not be available to be used for other purposes. For these items, please CLEARLY label all items with your Stake name, and if possible, use a colored tape that indicates your stake's color:

#### A) Foldable Chairs : 10-20

- a. Drop- off locations and instructions are indicated and highlighted below.
- B) Water Coolers for Water Stations: We need a total of 12.
  - a. Please bring at least 1, and 2 if you can spare them.
- C) 2 Full Propane Tanks, good condition, no rust (with the triangle-style connectors).
  - a. <u>Please deliver propane tanks directly to Hollander Hall</u> for use by our food people on Saturday, August 13<sup>th</sup> during camp set-up.

### **Folding Chairs and Water Coolers**

Fire Mountain does not have enough folding chairs or Water Coolers to accommodate all of our classes at Encampment.

### Instructions:

- Please CLEARLY label each foldable chair and Water Cooler with your Stake's name, and if possible with a colored tape that corresponds with your stake's color for easy identification.
- DROP-OFF your foldable chairs and Water Coolers, <u>at your assigned drop off location</u>, on Saturday, August 13<sup>th</sup> after 3pm for camp set-up.
- PICK-UP <u>your items at the same location</u> on **Saturday, August 20<sup>th</sup> after 12 noon**.

# 2. <u>Recommended Stake Camping Supplies and Equipment at YW</u> <u>Encampment</u>

#### Dear Sisters,

We are asking each Stake to be as self-sufficient as possible in providing equipment and camping supplies for their Young Woman and Leaders at Encampment. In an effort to anticipate those needs, here are a list of supply ideas you may find useful to have at your stake campsite during YW Encampment:

- 2 large Coolers with Ice
- X-Large Garbage can(s) for your campsite and Garbage bags
- Hammer, extra tent stakes, a few small nails
- Staple Gun, Staples and multiple pairs of plyer's
- Office Supplies such as:
  - Pens, pencils, sharpies, scissors, paperclips, tape, rubber bands, push-pins, paper, cardstock, glue, hole punch, post-it notes, highlighters, colored pencils, extra batteries, zip-lock bags, duct-tape, safety pins, rope to hang towels and dunk bags, clothespins, small sewing kit, etc.
- Wash cloths, sponge, soap, bleach, rubber gloves, paper towels
- American Flag for your Stake Flag Ceremony
- Bulletin board / white board for Stake Announcements or used as a message board, string, mirror, Clock
- Basic First Aid Kit with Band-Aids, tensor bandages, ice pack, tweezers, antibiotic cream, etc..
- Extra air mattress/blanket, sanitary supplies, flashlight, lanterns, toilet paper (just in case!)
- Tarp
- Matches, newspaper, kindling
- Tote-able bucket or container to transport water or diluted cleaning solutions
- Pop-ups/Canopies for shade
- Small wagon/wagons for hauling items
- A few bikes & Helmets for leaders if they would like to ride around camp
- Color day items for your stake
- Whistles for lifeguards/spotters
- Copies of "The Living Christ" for YW to work on Aspire Award if they haven't done any work at home.
- 10-20 folding chairs- REQUIRED
- 1-2 Water Coolers- REQUIRED
- Full Propane Tank- REQUIRED
- Lanterns/Good Sources of Light (for your Stake Firesides and Faith Walk)- REQUIRED

### A. Faith Walk/ Stake Firesides

Each night (M-Th) your Stake will either have Stake Time, a Stake Fireside, or will be participating in the Faith Walk. <u>Please bring your Stake's lanterns, or good portable sources of light, to your various locations.</u> Use them as the lighting to illuminate those who are presenting to you. These items should stay with your Stake throughout Encampment.

### B. General Campsite Information:

One broom, shovel, rake, and water bucket will be provided for each campsite by Fire Mountain. We will be utilizing many of the garbage cans located at Fire Mountain for the additional Porta potty and handwashing areas. Please plan on bringing an X-Large Garbage container for your Stake's use during the week, and label it clearly with your Stake's name. There will also be 2 Permanent Porta potty's, called "Kaibo's" (K-EYE-BO's) per campsite. Some of the larger stakes will be occupying up to 3 sites. There is a firewood shed at Fire Mountain that is stocked by volunteers, but with the dry, hot summer weather a burn-ban may be in effect.

### C. Kaibo's

Please remind all campers that no sanitary supplies, garbage, etc. are to go down any porta potty or toilet at camp. These items will plug up the pump trucks and make for a less than wonderful experience. Please remind them it's not the pump-trucks responsibility to unplug them...it's theirs. Please use the garbage containers for disposal. For the Kaibo's in your campsite, you may opt to bring:

- Air fresher's (we are the last camp after a lot of other Scout camps this summer at Fire Mountain)
- Tap or Press lights (it gets dark in there!)
- small garbage can/ small paper bags for inside the Ki-Bo for sanitary supplies
- Hand sanitizer

### D. Shower's and Water Conservation

We need to be conservative in our water usage, and courteous to the many other campers who may need a shower, and keep our showers brief. The Shower-House located between the Bellingham and Everett Stake campsites is only designed for a specific number of gallons a day and it is on a pump system. The pump system will shut-off and the water will start to backflow if it is overloaded, so please keep showers short so everyone has an opportunity to rinse off and have a pleasant experience.

Thank you for your efforts in serving the YW of your Stake and if, once at camp, you find you are in need of some item, or have questions, we will do our best to help you.
